





Operating Your Radio

- Extend the Telescopic Aerial.
- 2. Press the **POWER** button to switch on your radio. The display will show "**HELLO from AZATOM**."
- 3. If this is the first time using the unit, it will go into **DAB Mode** and automatically start an 'Auto Scan' to search for available stations. (If DAB Mode has been previously utilized, the radio will automatically choose the most recently played station when it is switched back on after being powered off.)
- 4. Pressing **SCAN** at any time will automatically scan and store stations. (During the scanning process, the lower line of the display shows a bar graph indicating progress of the scan.)
- 5. When the scan is complete the first station (in alphanumeric order) will be selected. The clock will automatically set to the current time.
- 6. If the station list is still empty after the scan your radio will display "Service Not Available".
- 7. If no stations are found, please ensure the aerial is extended and test the reception by doing another auto scan in a different location.

Note: Pressing the **POWER** button once will but the radio into standby and holding down the button will turn the radio off.

Connecting an External Aerial

The D4 is equipped with a standard F-type aerial connector, allowing you to improve reception by connecting an external aerial of your choice. Follow these steps to remove the built-in aerial and connect your own:

- Turn off the D4 and unplug it from the power source for safety before making any adjustments.
- 2. Locate the built-in telescopic aerial at the back of the unit.
- 3. Unscrew the telescopic aerial by turning it counterclockwise (left) until it detaches from the F-type connector.
- 4. Take your external aerial and ensure it has a compatible F-type connector.
- 5. Align the F-type connector of your external aerial with the socket on the device.
- 6. Screw in the external aerial by turning it clockwise (right) until it is snug. Do not overtighten.
- 7. Plug the device back in and power it on.
- 8. Perform a scan for available DAB or FM stations if necessary, to ensure you're receiving the best possible signal.

Note: The quality of reception depends on the type and positioning of the aerial. For optimal results, position your external aerial in a location with minimal obstructions and away from large metal objects or electronic devices.

DAB Radio

Selecting a Station

With your radio powered on, carefully extend the telescopic aerial fully.

- 1. Press **MODE** to enter "**DAB**" mode.
- 2. The top line of the display shows the name of the station currently selected.
- 3. Press << or >> buttons, or turn the enter dial to cycle through the list of available stations then press **ENTER** to tune into that station.

Auto Scan

To find new stations you can auto scan as follows.

- 1. Pressing SCAN at any time will automatically scan and store stations.
- 2. Or press the **MENU** button, then use the enter dial to highlight "Full Scan" and press **ENTER**.
- 3. The display will show "Scanning..." and your radio will perform a scan of the Band III DAB channels. As new radio stations are found the station counter on the right-hand side of the display will increase and the radio stations will be added to the list stored in the radio.

Secondary Services - DAB

- Some radio stations have additional secondary services associated with them. If a radio station has a secondary service associated with it the display will show ">>" next to the station name on the station list. The secondary service will then appear immediately after the primary services as you turn the dial.
- 2. Press ENTER to confirm the station selection.
- 3. When the secondary service shuts down, your radio will automatically switch back to the main radio station if it is available.

DAB Manual Scan

Manual tuning allows you to tune to the various DAB Band III channels. UK DAB stations located in the range 11B to 12D. This function is mainly used to assist the positioning of the aerial or the radio to optimise reception for a specific channel or frequency.

- Press MENU, then turn the enter dial to highlight "Manual Tune" and press ENTER.
- 2. Turn the dial to highlight your desired channel.
- 3. Press **ENTER**, the graph will indicate the signal strength, and the upper line will show the name of the DAB multiplex (group of radio stations). Any stations found will be added to the stored list in the radio.
- 4. Press **MENU** to return to the normal tuning mode.

Prune DAB

Prune: (To remove stations which are listed but unavailable).

- 1. In DAB mode, press **MENU** and turn the dial until "**Prune**" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 2. Turn enter dial to find "YES". Press ENTER button to confirm to prune.

Note: this removes all the invalid stations indicated in the station list with a "?" in front of the station name.

FM Radio

Selecting a Station

With your radio powered on, carefully extend the telescopic aerial fully.

- 1. Press MODE to enter "FM" mode.
- 2. The top line of the display shows the frequency of the station currently selected.
- 3. Press and hold << or >> buttons to cycle through the list of available stations, then you can fine tune the FM frequency by 0.05mHz by pressing the << or >> buttons once, then press ENTER to tune into that station.

Auto Scan

- 1. Press MODE to enter "FM" mode.
- 2. Press the **SCAN** button. Your radio will begin scanning for the next available frequency and will immediately play that station.
- You can also press and hold the << or >> buttons, to fast search to the next available FM station.

CD Player

Note: This unit will play pre recorded commercial compact discs, self-complied CD-RW discs. We can not guarantee playback quality of non standardized formats of CD-R/RW discs. The Manufacturer is not responsible for the playablity of CD-R/RW due to recording conditions such as PC performance, writing software, media properties etc.

Do not attach a label or seal to either side of the CD-R/RW disc. It may cause damage to the working internal components.

Play Mode

- Press MODE button to enter CD mode.
- 2. Insert a CD with the label side facing upward
- 3. Disc information (total number of tracks) will appear on the LCD Display.
- 4. Press PLAY/PAUSE button to start playing the CD.
- 5. While playing music, press the **PLAY/PAUSE** button to pause playback, press **PLAY/PAUSE** button again to resume playing.
- 6. Press STOP button to stop playing music.
- 7. To turn off the CD player, press **POWER** button.

Note: If skipping occurs during CD playback. Check the CD to ensure it is not scratched or damaged.

CD Usage With Remote Control

On the remote control you can use numbers 1 to 9 to select which track you want to play

Whilst CD is playing, press a number to choose that track.

Repeat Mode:

Repeat 1:

Press **PRESET** button once, you will see on bottom right of display. The current track will be repeated.

Repeat All Tracks:

Press **PRESET** button twice, you will see on the bottom right of the display. The whole disc will be played continuously.

Press **PRESET** button three times, you will see χ on the bottom right of the display. The whole disc will be played randomly.

To Cancel Repeat Functions:

Press PRESET button again to cancel the repeat function.

Skip & Search Mode

During pause mode, press the << or >> buttons to go to the next track or return back to the beginning of the current track.

During playback, press and hold the << or >> button to fast forward or rewind whilst playing your CD track.

Programming CD favourites

Note: This feature allows you to pick your favourite tracks to be played. Programming favourite playlists can only be set when CD is stopped.

- 1. Load CD and press STOP to make sure the CD is not playing
- 2. Press the **PRESET** button once you will see ★01 at the bottom of the display
- 3. Use the << or >> buttons to select the track you want to save in a playlist: Example: Go to T2 and press PRESET again, this will save track T2 in your playlist as ★01. The LCD display will then advance to ★02 ready for you to choose the next track to add to your playlist.
- 4. You can repeat step 3 to program up to 33 tracks on pre-recorded CD's or up to 99 mp3 tracks.
- 5. Press PLAY button to start the programmed playlist
- 6. Programmed tracks will be played through once and then stop. However you may use the **REPEAT** function to repeatedly play a certain track (Repeat 1) or all tracks in the program (Repeat All). You can also press << or >> buttons to freely move through your saved playlist.
- 7. To cancel program playlist press the **STOP** button twice during playlist playback

USB Memory Stick Playback

- Press MODE button and select USB mode.
- 2. Insert USB memory stick into the USB port on the rear of the Clockwood.
- 3. The Display will show "Reading..." when it finds the USB it will then display the Folder and track numbers. Example: "F1/10" shows on display meaning Folder 1 has 10 tracks. "T1/20" shows on display meaning track 1 is playing with 20 tracks total on USB stick.
- 4. Press **PRESET** to advance to next folder. **Note: only works If you have folders made.**
- 5. Press << or >> to go back one track or advance to next track.

EQ Settings

The D4 has a number of Music EQ modes you can selct from for prefered sound. There is also and independent Bass, Treble setting to fine turn.

- 1. Press MENU button. Turn dial to "System." Press ENTER.
- 2. Turn dial to choose from "Rock, Speech, Normal, Class, Jazz, Pop and My EQ."
- 3. Select "My EQ" for "Bass, Treble" settings.

Display Settings

Backlight Auto Setting:

- Press MENU and turn the dial until "System" is highlighted on the display then press ENTER.
- 2. Turn the dial until "*Backlight*" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 3. Turn the dial until "*Timeout*" is highlighted then press **ENTER**.
- 4. Turn the dial to choose between 10, 20, 30, 45, 60, 90, 120, 180 seconds, or "ON" to cancel auto dimmer. press ENTER to set.

Set Brightness:

While in any playing mode, push the **DIMMER** button on the dial to cycle through the different levels of Brightness. There is four levels of brightness to choose from, High, Medium, Low and Off.

Using Presets

You can save your preferred DAB and FM radio stations to the preset station memories. Your radio has a total of 60 memory presets, with 30 allocated for DAB and 30 for FM. The steps to store presets are the same for both DAB and FM modes.

- With the radio powered on, Press MODE button to choose "DAB" or "FM" mode.
- 2. IMPORTANT: Make sure the station you want to preset is actually playing.
- 3. Press and hold the **PRESET** button for until you see "*Preset store*" hightlighted on the screen (not "*Preset Recall*")
- 4. Using the dial, scroll along to the desired preset number that you wish to store the station to and press **ENTER**.
- 5. Once correctly stored, "**Preset 01 Stored**" will display on the screen. The station will be stored under the chosen preset. Repeat this process for any other stations you wish to save.

Note: Stations which have been stored in a preset slot may be overwritten by following the above procedure and selecting a already used slot.

Fast Preset

Remote - Use the numbered buttons **1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9** on the remote. Play the station you want to save. Press and hold the numbered button on the remote until you see "*Preset stored*". You can choose any of the preset number buttons. The maximum number of presets you can save this way is 9.

Recalling Presets:

- With the radio powered on, Press MODE button to choose "DAB" or "FM" mode.
- 2. Press the **PRESET** button to see "*Preset Recall*" not "*Preset Store*"
- 3. Using the dial. Scroll along to the desired preset number that you wish to play and press **ENTER.**

Fast Preset Recall:

If you have already saved your presets you can choose which one to play with the fast recall buttons.

Remote - Press 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 at any time to play any of your stored presets.

Note: If you have not previously stored a preset station and the preset button is pressed "Empty preset" will be displayed.

Bluetooth Input

To pair your device via Bluetooth for the first time:

- 1. Press **MODE** until "**BT**" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 2. After a few seconds, the speaker will automatically go into paring mode.
- 3. On your Bluetooth device (such as mobile phone) do a search and once available please select "Azatom D4".
- 4. Once connected, the screen will say "Bluetooth Connected".
- 5. You can press the ►II/SCAN on the front of the D4 to play and pause your music.

Bluetooth Transmit

Bluetooth Transmit allows you to listen wirelessly using Bluetooth headphones or AirPods.

- 1. Ensure your Bluetooth headphones or AirPods are fully charged and in pairing mode (refer to your device's instructions).
- 2. Press **BT TX** until you see "**TX**" appear in the top right corner of the screen. The unit will begin scanning for nearby Bluetooth devices and will automatically connect to any device in pairing mode.
- 3. Once paired, audio from the unit will play through your Bluetooth headphones.
- 4. Use the volume controls on the D4 to adjust the sound to your preference.

Please ensure your Bluetooth headphones are disconnected to listen to audio through the built-in speaker. Press and hold **BT TX** again to disconnect Bluetooth output.

Aux - In

Aux-in mode plays audio from an external source such as a smart phone.

- Plug one end of a 3.5mm audio cable (excluded) into the headphone or line out jack on your player or device, plug the other end of the cable into the unit Aux-In port.
- 2. Turn on the external audio source and play your device.
- 3. Press MODE button to "Aux Input" mode.
- 4. The volume level can be now controlled through the main unit.

Please ensure the cable is disconnected to listen to the radio in other modes such as DAB and FM.

Sleep Timer

Your radio can be set to turn off after a preset time period has elapsed. The sleep setting can be adjusted from 15 to 90 minutes.

- Press MENU and turn the dial until "System" is highlighted on the display then press ENTER.
- 2. Turn the dial until "*Sleep*" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 3. Turn the dial to cycle through the sleep timers. Choose between 15, 30, 45, 60 and 90 Minutes or Sleep Off which will cancel the sleep time.
- 4. Press **ENTER** to confirm the setting. The sleep timer indicator "€" will show on the display alongside a small countdown. Your radio will switch off after the pre-set sleep time has elapsed.
- 5. To cancel the sleep timer, repeat step 1 3 cycle through to "Sleep Off" and press ENTER to confirm.

Time & Date Settings

When the radio is first turned on and the scan has completed, the time and date should have automatically been set. If there is no DAB/FM signal available, you will need to set the time and date manually when turned on for the first time.

- Press MENU and turn the dial until "System" is highlighted on the display then press ENTER.
- 2. Turn the dial until "*Time*" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- Turn the dial to select "Set Time/Date" then press ENTER. You can also use the dial to set the Auto Update, Set 12/24 Hour, Set Date Format and Clock Style.
- 4. Turn the dial to set the hour, then press ENTER.
- Turn the dial to set the minutes, then press ENTER.
- 6. Turn the dial to set the day, then press **ENTER**.
- 7. Turn the dial to set the month, then press **ENTER**.
- 8. Turn the dial to set the year, then press ENTER.
- 9. After pressing ENTER, the time and date will be saved.

Alarm Settings

NOTE: PLEASE SELECT A RADIO STATION BEFORE SETTING THE ALARM. You will be given the option to choose from last station used or one of your favourite preset channels.

- 1. Press ALARM 1 or ALARM 2 to enter the alarm setup menu. Press ENTER to confirm.
- 2. Use the enter dial to set the alarm hour and press **ENTER** to confirm.
- 3. Use the enter dial to set the alarm minutes and press **ENTER** to confirm.
- 4. Use the enter dial to chose a duration: **15, 30, 45, 60, 75, 90 minutes** and press **ENTER** to confirm.
- 5. Use the enter dial to set alarm sound source, chooze between *Buzzer* / *FM / DAB* and press **ENTER** to confirm.
- 6. Use the enter dial to set when the alarm is active, you can choose *Once / Daily / Weekdays / Weekends*. Press **ENTER** to confirm.
- 7. Use the enter dial to set the alarm volume and press **ENTER** to confirm.
- 8. Use the enter dial to choose whether you want the alarm *ON/OFF* and press **ENTER** to confirm. Your Alarm is now saved

Note: At any time you can disable or enable the alarm. Press either **ALARM** 1 or **ALARM** 2, then press and hold the same alarm button to disable or enable the alarm.

Snooze

- 1. When the alarm sounds, pressing the dial will temporarily silence the alarm, you can choose the time from **5**, **10**, **15** & **30** minutes by turning the dial.
- 2. The snooze function also has a countdown allowing you to see how long before the alarm re-sounds.

Stop The Alarm

When the alarm is sounding you can press **ALARM** or **STANDBY** buttons to silence the alarm sound. The radio will then return to Standby mode - This cancels the alarm, to snooze please use the dial.

Languages

- 1. Press **MENU** and use the dial until "Settings" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 2. Turn the dial until "*Langauge*" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 3. Select which language you require from: English, Deutsch, Italiano, Français.

Factory Reset

If your radio fails to operate correctly, or some digits on the display are missing or incomplete, it may be possible to restore normal operation by carrying out a system reset. This will restore the radio's settings to their factory defaults. If you have moved to a different part of the country and you wish to erase local DAB radio stations that are no longer available from the stored list, then you may carry out this procedure.

Note: All your presets will be erased throughout this procedure

- Press MENU and use the dial until "System" is highlighted on the display then press ENTER.
- 2. Press **MENU** and use the dial until "*Factory Reset*" is highlighted on the display then press **ENTER**.
- 3. If you wish to perform the reset operation, use the dial until "YES" is highlighted on the display and press ENTER. A full reset of your radio will be performed, All preset stations & station lists will be erased.
 - If you do not wish to reset your radio turn the dial until "NO" is highlighted and press **ENTER** to confirm. Your radio will return to the previous menu.
- 4. After a system reset a scan of the DAB band will be automatically performed.

If your radio locks at any time you can use the **ON/OFF** switch button on the rear of the radio. Turn the device Off then back On and it will reboot.

Earphones

Note: Earphones are not included with the D4 Radio

- Plug the earphones into the Earphone socket on the rear of your radio.
- 2. Check that the Volume level is not too loud before placing the ear-pieces into your ears.

FM Stereo/Mono (Earphones only)

Use this if a FM station being received has a weak signal and some distortion is audible (especially when listening using earphones).

- Press MENU and turn the dial until "Audio Setting" is highlighted on the display then press ENTER.
- 2. Turn the dial until "Forced Mono" is highlighted on the display then press ENTER.
- 3. To return to stereo mode turn the dial until "Audio Setting" is highlighted then press the ENTER.
- 4. Turn the dial to highlight "Stereo Allowed" and press ENTER. Your radio will switch to stereo mode.

Note: Stereo listening is only available when listening via earphones.
